## Conference COVID-19 Policies

### Vaccination & Testing Policy

All conference attendees (students, faculty, staff, and guests) must pre-register in order to receive credentials and be allowed access to any conference spaces or activities. In addition to pre-registration, attendees must register and be approved via the [CrowdPass](#) health & clearance online application. Attendees may submit either:

Proof of Vaccination	Proof of Negative Test
<p>Vaccinated attendees may submit proof of “full vaccination,” meaning they have completed the full series of vaccinations (typically two doses) with sufficient time having passed (typically two weeks) to be considered “fully vaccinated” based on the guidelines for the vaccine received.</p> <p>Vaccine proof must match their legal name, which must also align with the name provided during pre-registration.</p>	<p>Attendees may take a COVID-19 PCR or rapid antigen test within 3 days prior to the conference (February 20-23) and submit negative results. Written results or reports from on-campus or other healthcare providers are acceptable, as are screenshots or PDF results from testing vendors. Pictures of at-home tests will not be accepted. After testing, attendees are strongly encouraged, to isolate prior to traveling to the conference.</p>

No health information is collected by MMUN; proof of vaccination or negative test should be provided via [CrowdPass](#) only. Details regarding how CrowdPass collects and secures data is available in their [Privacy Policy](#). In the week before and while traveling to MMUN, attendees are asked to take appropriate precautions to prevent themselves from contracting COVID-19.

### Masking Policy

All conference attendees (students, faculty, staff, and guests) will be required to wear masks for the vast majority of conference activities. While cloth masks are acceptable, attendees are encouraged to utilize surgical, N95, KN95, or cloth masks with filters and adjustable nose pieces as is feasible.

Masks are required in all conference spaces and during all conference activities, including:

- During opening and closing ceremonies
- During head delegate, faculty, and other meetings
- While caucusing during a suspension of any meeting
- While seated during formal session
- While rising to a point, motion, or asking a question of staff or another delegate
- During informal conference activities, including the delegates dance

Attendees may choose to briefly remove their mask when:

- Giving a formal speech from the microphone (this does not apply to Security Council)
- Briefly when posing for a picture
- While eating or drinking, including coffee and water during conference activities; when drinking while near others, attendees should practice “sip and cover,” immediately re-masking when not actively drinking
